

# Te Turama Scholarship

## Te Whāriki – Students in Early Childhood Education (Level 5)

### Background

This scholarship was established for students that who have demonstrated a high level of academic achievement, leadership or service at a secondary school and/or wider community. New Zealand School of Education wishes to offer the recipient the opportunity to extend their education in order to improve their level of skills.

### Amount and type of award

- The number of new scholarships to be awarded is determined annually.
- Two scholarship will be offered on a contestable basis.
- The award consists of contribution towards tuition fees or course related costs.

### Tenure of award

\$1,500 contribution towards tuition fees.

### Eligibility criteria

- Be a New Zealand Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Demonstrate leadership or service in the school and/or wider community.
- Clear career goals related to the programme of study.
- Genuine interest in developing children through Early Childhood Education

### Document requirements

All applications must include the following documents:

- A copy of ID, proof of NZ citizenship/residency (NZ birth certificate, Passport or Passport with NZ residency).
- One written references. This must be from an employer, lecturer, teacher or respected person (school person, or community leader) who can be contacted by the selection panel.
- Have a certified copy of academic transcript (Secondary and/or Tertiary).
- A current curriculum vitae including any community contribution and/or leadership activities.
- A supporting letter in which the applicant addresses how they meet the criteria for the scholarship. The letter should include key achievements to date, career goals and contribution to the community.

### Selection process

Applicants will be considered by a selection panel from the New Zealand School of Education. The decision of the selection panel is final.

### Conditions of award

- The award will go directly into the applicant's Studylink account or applicant's bank account if the fees if the scholarship is for course related costs.
- The scholarship may not be held in conjunction with any other fees scholarships.
- The recipient who withdraws from study during the tenure of the scholarship will be expected to repay the full value of the scholarship.
